Vocational Rehabilitation

Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) is a federal-state program that helps people who have physical or mental disabilities get or keep a job. VR is committed to helping people with disabilities find meaningful careers. VR offers supported employment for individuals with the most significant disabilities who need support services to succeed in competitive employment.

Supported Employment:

- Pays the same wage as other employees
- Promotes social interaction, productivity, and the best use of a person's skills and abilities
- Takes place in an integrated work setting
- Helps individuals with developmental disabilities, severe and persistent mental illnesses, or other significant disabilities
- Includes job coaching that is often provided by an employment specialist after placement on the job
- Offers support services
- Builds extended, ongoing supports with agencies and partners outside of VR to help you keep your job

Examples of VR Services

- Medical and Psychological Assessment
- Vocational Evaluation and Planning
- Career Counseling and Guidance
- Training and Education After High School
- Job-Site Assessment & Accommodations
- Job Placement
- Job Coaching
- On-the-Job Training
- Supported Employment
- Hearing Aids/Assistive Technology
- Time-Limited Medical and/or Psychological Treatment

Supports may include arranging transportation, placement, training or retraining the supported worker, developing natural supports, and assistive technology, if needed, to perform job duties.
